



Birmingham retrofit

Equans has been appointed by Birmingham City Council to deliver a significant decarbonisation programme for 1,600 council properties, as part of a £111m contract.

Birmingham has 92,990 households in fuel poverty, equivalent to 21.1 per cent, which is higher than national average at 13.8 per cent.

Properties in the city council's housing portfolio are also on average 70 years old, which means the stock is a large net contributor to the city's carbon emissions. This new retrofit programme will implement low carbon technologies across varying properties from high and low rise flats, whole-house schemes and hard to heat non-traditional homes.

Equans also supported the council with its successful application for the latest round of the Social Housing Decarbonisation Fund – which secured a £24.8m cash injection towards the retrofit work.
